Greater New Orleans Chapter of the Compassionate Friends conducted its Annual Worldwide Candle Lighting.

Our Greater New Orleans Chapter is very proud that we have participated in the **TCF Worldwide Candle Lighting**. Nearly 100 people joined us at Lafreniere Park to light candles in remembrance for all children who have died too soon. As we lit our **Candles of Love**, we joined with hundreds of thousands of bereaved families who lit candles at 7 PM in every time zone around the world creating a "wave of light" that encircled the earth in memory of all children, grandchildren, brothers and sisters who died **"That their light may always shine."** Thanks to our chapter members who participated in the setup, readings, and teardown. Members and their families brought picnics and shared in fellowship. The presentation of poems, songs, and our children's pictures were projected on two large screens. THE NEW YEAR: A TIME OF HOPE

Another New Year has slipped into our lives, radically changing some things and leaving other things to evolve naturally. For bereaved parents a new year marks another year on the calendar without their precious children. It is a new year, but not much has changed since the old year. Why is that?

We act as the catalysts of change for ourselves. We choose to help ourselves; we choose to stay in a specific place in our grief. We choose to reach out for hope or we choose to withdraw into the familiar and postpone facing life and hope another day. There are no set rules or specific timetables in bereavement. We are each unique in our grief.

Eventually we all find hope. We find it in different ways and in different times. There will be no one moment of epiphany for bereaved parents. Instead, there are a series of minutes, hours, weeks, months and often years until we realize that we can truly say we feel the power of hope coming alive from deep within us. This moment will come for each of us. It will come in its own time and its own way.

Even those of us who have found hope and who shine its light on the paths of newly bereaved parents, still regress and withdraw into the dark sadness of our loss. And that is as it should be. For we have lost the most precious gift of our lives...our children's presence with us and their future in this life. Our children live in our hearts and our memories and our dreams. They do not share this plane with us. It is normal and it is good to think of our children often and to shed some tears for all that has been lost. These aren't setbacks as much as sweet memories that bring cathartic tears.

The element we find in these memories is a closeness to our child and our child's life. This, too, is healthy. An often-expressed fear is that our children will be forgotten. Worry not, gentle parent, your child will be remembered for all of your days and for many days thereafter. You will never forget your child. Others who knew your child will never forget. The proof of this is in our memories....sweet memories that take us back to another time when our child was with us.

So this New Year's, whether you are a few months, a few years or many years in your grief, think about hope. You have not forsaken your child when you reach for hope. Your hope brings your child back in a positive way that will warm your heart. Reach for that hope. As you move forward in your grief in the New Year, reach for hope. Your child will still be with you. And one day you will find that your child's presence is sweeter when hope is within you.






Newsletter Dedication in Loving Memory Of My Son Jonathan Ríchard Wallace

There will be days when your grief is deep and consuming, dark and lonely.

I hope you find refuge in supportive friends, family, and counselors on the days when you most need someone to sit beside you in that darkness.

There will be days when your grief is a bit more subtle and silent, content with buzzing in the background instead of being center stage.

I hope you don't feel guilty for the days when this allows you to feel joy or hope. These days are so deeply important as you move forward at your own pace.

There will be days when your grief turns on a dime, demanding different things from you moment to moment, giving you emotional whiplash as you try and keep up.

I hope you are gentle with yourself on these days. Your heart is looking for ways to process a love that has changed due to loss (a love that is still present, but in a different way). That is a lot of work on a weary soul.

There will be days when your grief softens enough to allow your mind to wander in memories, to rejoice in remembering, to allow the light to trickle in to the most painful spaces.

And on those days, I hope you let the comfort wrap around you like a warm sweater. I hope you let the light in and feel it surrounding you.

Because grief will bring about many different kinds of days.

May we take them one day at a time, one moment at a time, and make room for the tension that it brings.

SEEKING LEAD VOLUNTEERS FOR THE 2024 TCF NATIONAL CONFERENCE

The 2024 TCF National Conference will be right here in New Orleans at the Marriott Hotel at the foot of Canal Street. While many people will be volunteering to work during the event, Local Volunteers will be needed to assist in the Lead Roles of several events. If you would like to volunteer for one of these Lead Role Committees please contact me at your earliest convenience. This is a wonderful opportunity to volunteer for a wonderful cause and to be able to do so in honor of your child, grandchild, or sibling.

Local volunteers needed for the following Committee Lead Roles:

Centerpieces

Centerpiece committee members and volunteers will place centerpieces and cards on tables prior to the Friday lunch or the Saturday dinner.

Comfort Support Committee

The Comfort Support Committee is a group of volunteers who are available during registration and throughout the conference for new attendees, newly bereaved, and anyone who needs extra support during the conference. The Comfort Support Committee is especially important during heavy registration times, including when registration first opens.

Fundraising

Conference co-chairs and committee are an important and integral part of fundraising efforts for the national conference. Conference donations can come from local or national corporations, local businesses, family members, and friends.

Gathering Place

This is a room or area for conference attendees to relax and gather throughout the conference weekend. The Gathering Place typically has soft furniture (couches and chairs), as well as several round tables with chairs. There is typically a long table along one wall for attendees to share chapter newsletters or other items of interest to conference attendees.

Reflection Room

The Reflection Room is a small, cozy room located in a quiet area of the hotel. It is decorated with comfortable furnishings to allow a "quiet zone" for attendees who need a break from the activity of the conference. The reflection room may include Soothing items, Table-top fountain, Soft music, Memory stones

Registration Bags

The Local Committee solicits donations for items to include in the registration bags. A team of volunteers help to fill the bags at the conference.

Silent Auction (Local Lead to work with Silent Auction Chair)

The Silent Auction Lead will work with local volunteers to secure and organize silent auction items. Local volunteers will help the Silent Auction Lead with receiving and organizing silent auction items.

Walk to Remember

The Walk to Remember Lead will work with volunteers to coordinate the Walk to Remember. As a group, they will plan the walk and ensure that there are enough volunteers along the walk route. They will also secure a water sponsor for donated water bottles. Additionally, they will help to organize and hand out Walk Signs that will be carried by walkers.
